

DOGSLEDDING ADVENTURE IN THE YUKON

7 NIGHTS / 8 DAYS



Challenge yourself on this fun dogsledding adventure! What could be more exhilarating than roaming through the Yukon wilderness on a dogsled and enjoying an enchanting night in a base camp log cabin or a comfortable wall tent camp? You will explore untouched wilderness inhabited by herds of elk, caribou and other interesting wildlife. Relive history as you discover Gold Rush relics and feel like a professional musher as you travel down the Yukon Quest Trail. Most important is the harmony you will feel with nature and your spirited team of Huskies. For the first few days, Sky High Ranch will be your base camp from which you lead your dogs out into the Yukon's white wonderland. You will then leave behind the last remnants of civilization and head out to the Tent Camp at McIntyre Mountain Road - true northern wilderness! Dogsledding is a comparable physical activity to cross-country skiing, so you should be in relatively good physical health.

YOUR PACKAGE INCLUDES

- Meet and greet (in English) at Whitehorse airport/downtown
- Transfers
 - Whitehorse airport/downtown to Sky High Ranch
 - Sky High Ranch to Whitehorse
 - Whitehorse to Whitehorse airport/downtown
- 6 nights shared accommodation at Base Camp in cabins and heated Wall Tent Camp and last night accommodation in Whitehorse at River View Hotel
- Sightseeing tour of Whitehorse
- Guided dogsledding with 3 to 6 Huskies per sled (30 - 60 km per day)
- Professional musher/guide (English and French speaking)
- Full board from dinner on Day 1 to lunch on Day 7

ACCOMMODATION DESCRIPTION

Base camp: the main building at Sky High Valley Ranch is a 2-storey log lodge with 3 bedrooms upstairs for double or single occupancy. Two of the bedrooms have single bunk beds and the third has a single bunk on top with a queen-sized bunk on the bottom. Also upstairs is a large main sitting area with couches for lounging facing a panoramic bay window. Downstairs there are 2 bedrooms, one with two sets of single bunks and the other with a single bunk on top and a queen-sized bunk on the bottom. There is also an open kitchen and eating area, complete with woodstove and propane appliances. There is no toilet (the outhouses are nearby) but there is a shared washroom with a sink and shower facilities.

Wall tents

Each tent sleeps 4 passengers and a guide. Inside the tents are raised, wooden sleeping platforms 0.5 m off the ground and a cast iron woodstove. Cooking is done on an outside fire pit, over the open fire with wooden benches around it. There are outhouse facilities.
